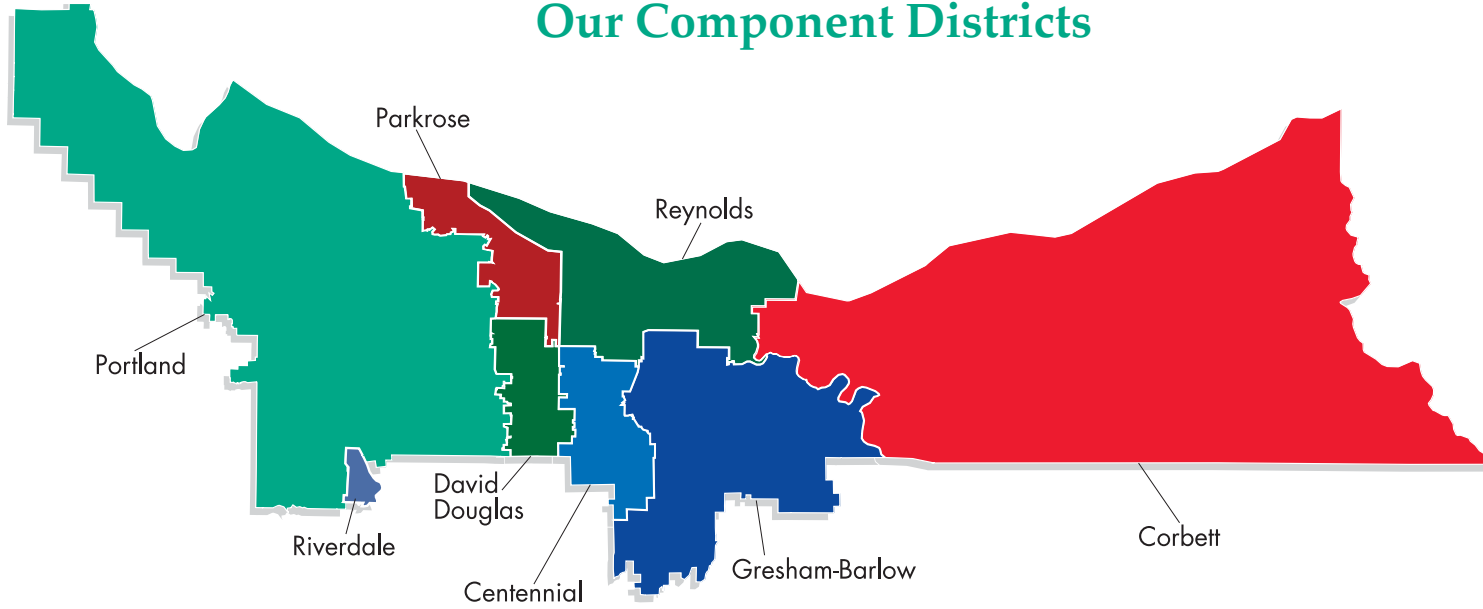

MESD at a glance

- Multnomah Education Service District is a public agency responsible for a variety of direct and indirect educational services to eight Multnomah County school districts as well as other public and private agencies and schools in the region.
- In the 2009-11 biennium, MESD manages annual expenditures of approximately \$67 million and employs about 700 staff.
- Multnomah ESD improves the quality of educational services through a cooperative system of shared services and programs. In essence, Multnomah ESD's services are those best managed on a regional basis either because they are too costly for an individual district to support, or because demand for the service within a single district is limited.
- MESD's "menu" of services allows component districts to choose only those programs and services deemed essential to their students, families, teachers and schools. In addition, districts benefit from several grant-funded projects managed by MESD.

Funding

- MESD has a diversified funding mix with approximately half of all revenue coming from state and local tax revenue and half from contracts, grants, tuition, Medicaid, interest and fees.

Fiscal Accountability and Cost Containment

- Multnomah ESD operates under the financial oversight of an elected board. Program operation is guided by Oregon statutes and administrative rules. MESD's programs are audited annually by an independent CPA.
- Ninety percent of MESD's General Fund revenue is spent on direct services to component districts and ten percent is used for administrative costs, in accordance with Oregon law. By operating within this "90/10" requirement, MESD's specialized, quality programs and services are provided at an affordable cost.
